STUDENT EXPECTATION GUIDE

1. Preparedness: Students should come prepared with a list of questions and concepts they want clarified, bringing all relevant material to the sessions.
2. The Session: Students should be respectful, ensuring all actions are in line with the University's Student Code of Conduct. Students should also clearly communicate when they do not understand something during the session.
3. Time: The tutor's time should be respected (i.e – students should be punctual and should try not to miss sessions).
4. Pay: Students should finalize hourly rates with the tutor before a session and pay them on time.
5. Academic Integrity: Students should focus on learning from the tutor, not getting their work done by them. Getting a tutor to do one's work falls under Academic Dishonesty and the consequences can be harsh. See Academic Calendar.
6. Ending the relationship: If the sessions make you feel uncomfortable because of the tutor doing or saying something inappropriate, if you feel you are not getting what you expected or if the tutor breaks academic policy, know that you should stop setting further sessions with the tutor and report any concerns to the SMUSA VP Academics.
